Residential Permit Parking Program (RPPP) Process Update

- Survey ballots mailed Feb. 17 to CT residences in project area
 - Ballot postmark deadline was March 11
 - Balloting will
 - inform City Council decision
 - determine whether a block “opts in” to RPPP *if* City Council approves program
 - *IF* City Council approves program, implementation would begin in September, 2009

Residential Permit Parking Program Basics

- Enforceable: Monday – Friday, 8:00am – 5:00pm
- Exempted: Weekend, holidays, 2 hours anytime
- Resident vehicle permit \$25 per year, 2 free “hangtag” guest permits, daily permits \$2

~~■ New blocks can opt in via petition each August~~

Follow-ups and special circumstances

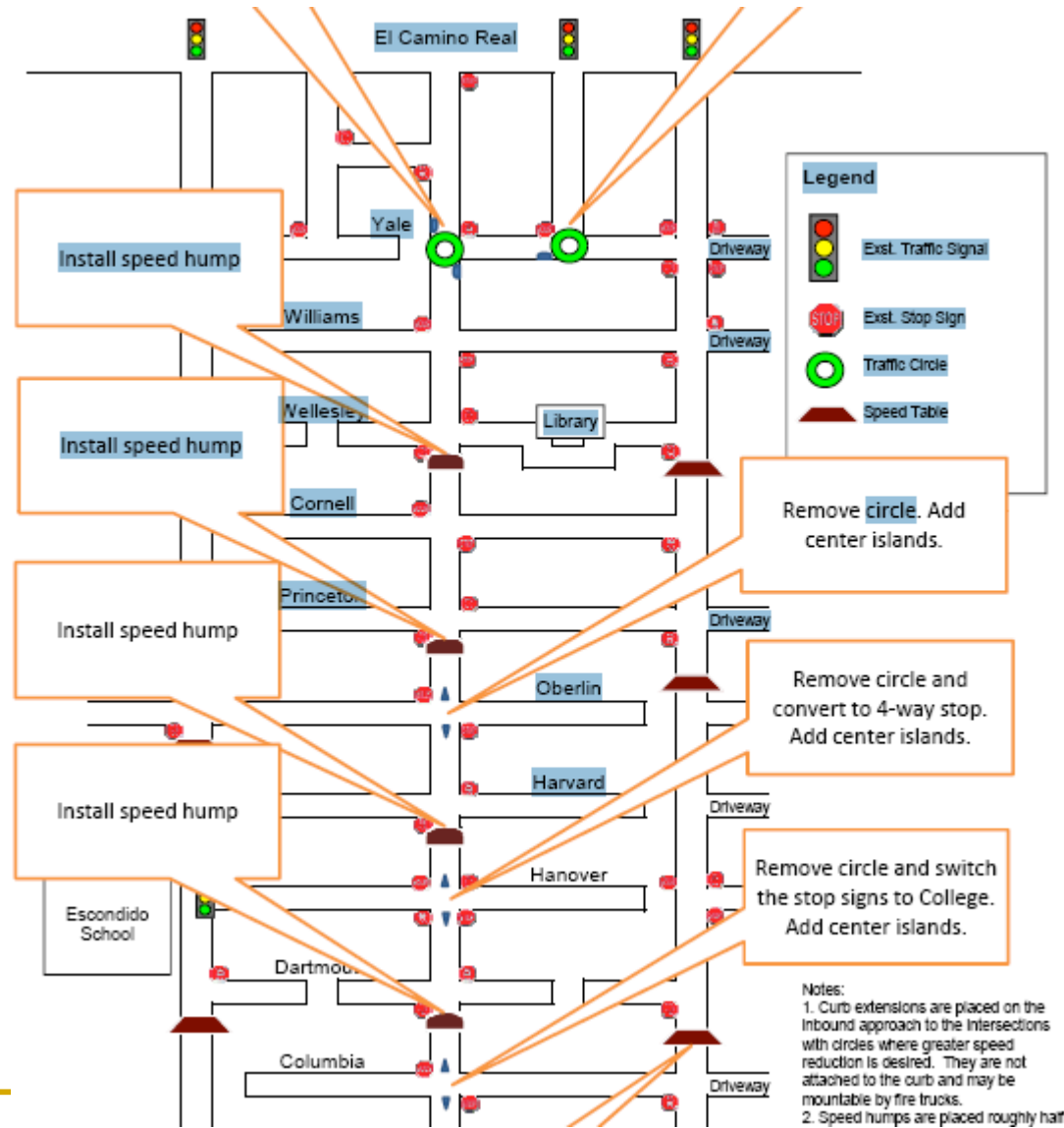
- City-pledged follow-ups
 - Parking issues in CN zone (Cambridge, Staunton, commercial frontage near El Camino)
 - 2000 block Wellesley: Monitor reduction of parking problems after 5:00 p.m.
 - Special Circumstances:
 - Vehicles with Disabled Person placard or plates
 - Permits for caregivers when resident has no car
 - Partial-year residents
 - Get involved: See contact info on green FAQ

Traffic Calming Process Update

- 1999 neighborhood petition for traffic calming
- 2004 (Nov.): City Council approval of trial plan
- 2006 (Dec.): Trial begins (now in place 2 years)
- Lots of meetings + resident feedback; constraints
- 2008: traffic circle petition + 2 minor changes
- Coming: city mailer w/ 3 options: Return to nothing, keep as is, or modifications

Process Update

- What is being proposed?
 - Change in zone on site from CN to PC
 - Process steps to date
 - Preliminary review at P&TC (Feb '08)
 - Task Force assembles (March)
 - Applicant outreach at Ananda Church (April)
 - New plans; 2nd preliminary review at P&TC (October)
 - Task Force survey (November - December)
 - Updated plans submitted for formal review (January '09)

Next Steps

- City's formal PC review process
 - Initial review at P&TC (April 29 tentative date)
 - Architectural Review Board hearing(s)
 - City's completion of environmental impact assessment
 - CalTrans decision on parking garage ramps
 - Final review and recommendation at P&TC
 - Decision at City Council
